



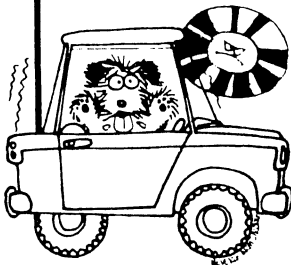

**Leaving Your Pet
In A Parked Car
Can Be
A Deadly Mistake**



On a warm day, the temperature in your car can reach 160° in a matter of minutes, even when the windows are partially open.

With only hot air to breathe, your pet can quickly suffer brain damage or die from heatstroke.

The Humane Society of the United States warns: When it's hot—leave your pet at home!

Open windows, shaded parking areas or air conditioned cars with the motor off won't save your pet's life.

In addition, be sure you know these signs of heat stress: heavy panting, glazed eyes, rapid pulse rate, dizziness, vomiting, or a deep red or purple tongue.

If your dog does become overheated, get him into the shade and take these emergency steps:

- Apply ice packs or cold towels to the head, neck and chest.
- Don't give an unlimited amount of cold water. Let him lick ice cubes or even ice cream.
- Get the dog to a veterinarian immediately. It could save your pet's life.

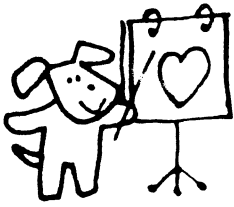
SUMMER CAMPAIGN

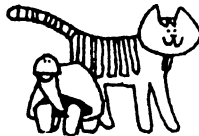

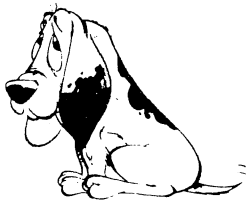

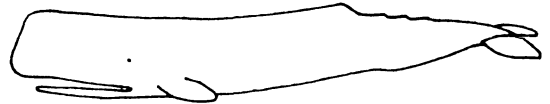


ALMOST FREE

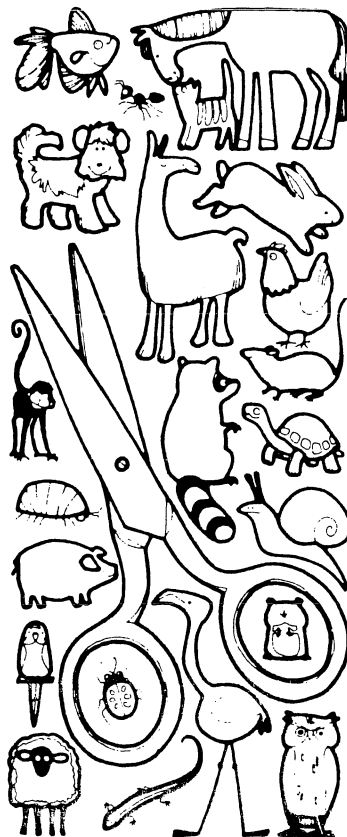

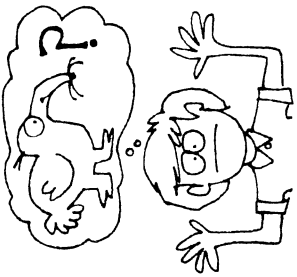
